



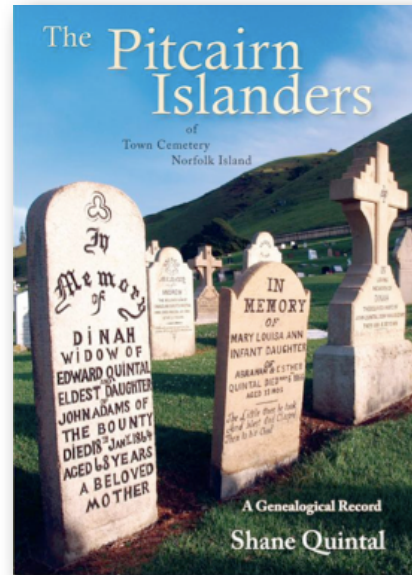

The Pitcairn Islanders of Town Cemetery Norfolk Island

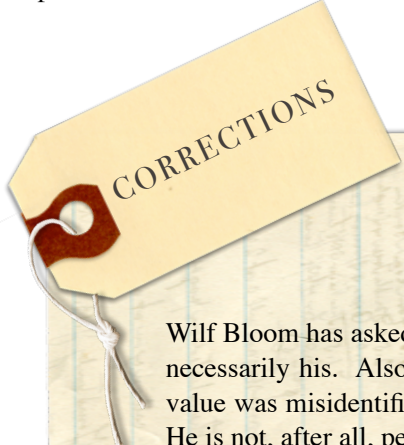

Members of our study group have varying interests. With some, it's genealogy. For those, this publication should be of great interest. It continues the family genealogies of those who arrived on Norfolk Island in 1856 and did not return to Pitcairn Island on either the 1858 or 1863 return trips.

The organization of the material is somewhat puzzling. The entries do not appear to follow a logical sequence. However, this does not present a problem. There is an excellent index, by name, of the various individuals. Most entries have a picture of the memorial marker and in some cases, a picture of the individual. Diary excerpts of their deaths and burials appear on various pages and add a wonderful, personal touch that enhance the reader's interest.



The book's presentation is well done. The supplemental and cursory material provides additional value. This includes pictures of the Islanders, letters and other material from the archives of Norfolk Island. Most of the pictures and letters are seen here first, making this a "must have" for many libraries.
