LOT 1: Massive Pitcairn collection to 1983 in five hardbound Elbe albums. The first album is autographed by Floyd H. McCoy and dated July 1, 1960 during his visit to the U.S. See full description of the five albums and contents on the opposite page. Total 2025 Scott's retail is \$1,096.03. Because of the weight of the five albums, shipping must be to the U.S. only. Great opportunity for a special collection! EST: ??

LOT 2: Here is an interesting pair of receipts (each 6x8 inches) from the Pitcairn Island Post Office dated 1951 and 1953. The form is a receipt for postage stamps sold and provides spaces for denomination, number, value in Sterling, etc. However, in this case, each was used as a note to a customer and signed by postmaster Roy Clark. In one, Roy notes, "I'm fed up with these stamps already." The forms are numbered "47" and "48." Unique! EST: \$25.00++

LOT 3: Envelope with rubber-stamp address of "Commissioner for Pitcairn" in Auckland, New Zealand with Pitcairn postmark of February 27, 1984. Has signature of "BChristian" at bottom Very nice. EST: \$10.00?

LOT 4: Scott #206-208, 1981 Royal Wedding with "damaged panel variety" marked on glassine. Not evident on any stamp and unrecorded by Kisling. Want to take a chance? EST: \$5.00++

LOT 5: A set of promotional bromides (used in the era for publications) of the 1976 U.S. bicentennial issue with note, "With the compliments of Pitcairn Island Administration / Auckland office." EST: \$5.00?

LOT 6: Scott #118, 1971 Royal Visit overprint, plate block of four, 1A, lower left corner. CV= \$9.60. EST: \$5.00++

LOT 7: Nice 1938 radio cover with colorful cachet and March 18, 1938 special cancel. Also signed by Andrew Young, "Radio Operator, Pitc." Unaddressed but in very good condition for age. EST: \$25.00++

LOT 8: Another interesting special event cover, this one dated in October 1984 and titled "Pilgrimage by Pitcairn Descendants from Norfolk Island to Pitcairn Island." Has stamps of Pitcairn, French Polynesia, Norfolk, New Zealand as well as special cachets and postmarks on front and reverse. Unaddressed, clean. EST: \$20.00+

LOT 9: Used copy of Scott #70, 1/- value with strong print colors (regular copy included for comparison). EST: \$5.00?

LOT 10: Interesting 5 x 6.75 inch brown cover with Great Britain King George V Silver Jubilee stamp set, one stamp on each corner. Cover is addressed to England and is marked "REGISTERED" at right. Stamps cancelled with partial CDS but date and location unknown. On reverse, there are two Pitcairn circular datestamps, one dated October 7, 1941 and the other dated October 14, 1941. Why a week apart? Ship departure delay? EST: \$20.00++

LOT 11: Interesting 1938 New Zealand cover to U.S. Printed marking "Ocean Letter" crossed out, several special markings. Reverse side has Pitcairn "Radio Communications" CDS dated June 24, 1938. Very nice. EST: \$25.00++

LOT 12: Small cover from Pitcairn with CDS "9 OCT 53" cancelling 1/- stamp. Cover addressed to U.S., has registration marking at left. Reverse has three CDS, one of Canal Zone and two of Philadelphia. Neat and clean. EST: \$10.00++

LOT 13: Small 1977 Pitcairn cover to England with Wellington, N.Z. Packet Boat cancels and imprint of MS *Medic* of London. No markings on reverse, but clean cover. Marked "\$10" in pencil on reverse. EST: \$5.00+

LOT 14: Small cover, unaddressed, *Bounty* approaching Pitcairn cachet, 1d New Zealand stamp cancelled Oct. 14, 1940 (last day of N.Z. Postal Agency) and Oct. 15, 1940 (first day of Pitcairn Post Office). Clean EST: \$10.00++

LOT 15: Postcard showing fish on Pitcairn dock, signed by Brenda Salt, no stamp, dated 1986. EST: \$5.00?

LOT 16: Can anyone use four 1992 Royal New Zealand airdrop covers with Pitcairn stamps?..... EST: \$5.00+

LOT 17: How about two unaddressed covers with 1977 50 years of postal service handstamps, etc.. EST: \$5.00

LOT 18: Similar covers (3) with Silver Jubilee stamps, postal service handstamp, etc. Clean. EST: \$10.00

LOT 19: Small blue airletter sheet, unaddressed, with 6d bird stamp, CDS "19 OCT 64" folded. EST: ??

LOT 20: Clean, colorful unaddressed cacheted cover for 80th anniversary of first sailing of ship *Pitcairn*. U.S. and Pitcairn stamps and special circular handstamp cachet for U.S. Bicentenary in 1976. EST: 5.00+
